

Disposal of DustCount 9000-ZX Series Products

EU Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive:

The European Union (EU) implemented the EU WEEE Directive 2002/96/EC and the WEEE Recast Directive 2012/19/EU requiring producers of electronic and electrical equipment (EEE) to manage and finance the collection, reuse, recycling and to appropriately treat WEEE that the producer places on the EU market after August 13, 2005. The goal of this directive is to minimize the volume of electrical and electronic waste disposal and to encourage re-use and recycling at the end of life.
